RCONA Executive Reports

<u>Approval of Jan. 2018 Minutes</u>: January minutes were not received, so they will be recreated and distributed at the March 2018 meeting.

Receipt of Treasurer's Report: Hearing no inquiries or objections, the President ordered the Treasurer's Report dated January 1, 2018 to February 16, 2018, placed on file as submitted.

Round Table proceeded with abbreviated comments as follows.

<u>Roseville Police:</u> Lt. Brian Lewis (joined later by Off. Matthew Jones) gave updates on the following:

- Noted 22 residential burglaries last month; 15 of these were garages left open.
- Explosion and fire in the Vineyard/Foothill Blvd. area was result of a "Honey oil" (cannabis extract paste) lab.
- A number of officers are currently attending Haz-Mat academy in Roseville.
- Series of burglaries along Sierra College Blvd. corridor from Stoneridge to Johnson Ranch area, one suspect was caught.
- Lt. Lewis working with Rob Baquera to create security video, reflect awareness and low-cost security remedies.
- Traffic Units will focus target top 10 intersections of concern.
- Homeless—unit called HOP, focusing on parks, have interaction 30-40 times per day; expect headcount statistic recently taken should be lower than last year.
- Crime suppression unit is focusing on human trafficking/prostitution and checking for other grants covering other drug and vice interests.
- If you have a home security camera, sign-up on Police website. Lt. Lewis will check with Megan to create 'shortened' website name.
- Oakmont High—student brought a gun to school; patrol units regularly assigned at Oakmont, Woodcreek Oaks, and Adelante campuses.
- Kaye Swain stated there is a petition pending to tighten up offenses that were previously lowered to lesser offenses.

Roseville Fire: Jaime Garrett gave updates:

- Station #1—expected move-in April 2nd, dedication in May, Open House later.
- Will hire 2 new firefighters, academy starting March.
- Fire Camp will be held in June—notice for applications going out next week.
- Recent fire in WestPark—fire alarms enabled people to escape in time.

City Report: None

Updates from NA Representatives (see above)

<u>Pleasant Grove</u>—40 members attended January meeting; Guest speaker County Supervisor Jack Duran talked about upcoming area progress.

<u>Stoneridge</u>—Mayor Susan Rohan will attend 3/8 meeting; topic to be Harry Crabb Park; planning shredding fundraiser and NA clean up. Building on social media sources.

<u>South Cirby</u>—Colleen Cole arranging guest speakers for next General Meeting 4/10, planning NA garage sale.

<u>Fiddyment Farm</u>—City Manager Rob Jensen gave Mello Roos presentation at meeting; basically stated that the NA was creating a 'shortfall' to the City because we have no commercial businesses.

<u>WestPark</u>—Disagreed, said Rob Jensen said we don't break even; City is negotiating with county to resolve issues with Amoruso development to fully break even.

<u>Folsom Road</u>—Meeting next Thursday, invited developers of local projects to attend; bridges project starting in spring.

<u>Maidu</u>—Encouraged newsletter to communicate with NA; held catered meal to thank newsletter delivery members. NA Garage Sale will be 4/28.

<u>Roseville Heights</u>—NA coordinating with St. Anton developers for affordable housing project on Main Street, VA representative key member; concerned over potential parking issues.

<u>Cherry Glen/Theiles Manor</u>—changed to a new meeting schedule; planning for NNO.

Woodcreek Oaks—Meeting bi-monthly now; extending NA newsletter.

Agenda Items & Committee Updates:

<u>Admin</u>: Werner discussed suggestion to change RCONA Board meetings to 6:30 PM and asked NA reps to consider for possible vote next month; Sue said Mahany rooms could accommodate an earlier start time.

<u>NUSA</u> (Birmingham 5/22-5/26): Procedure was sent out previously, submit interest letter to E-Board before 3/8 E-Board meeting; budget for one attendee this year.

<u>Engage Roseville</u>: Werner discussed various sources to voice your opinions on county budget priorities; Community Conversation meeting 2/26 at Maidu (waiting list); possible 2nd one in March at The Grounds.

<u>Finance</u>: Werner said CBF grant application was submitted to the city; Robert Sanchez plans to visit commission meetings. Sue Cook indicated the 2017 RCONA Audit was completed and corporate filings completed—thanked NAs for submitting their reports; she also noted that the bank was moving and notified everyone to download and save their documents.

<u>Placer Leadership Conferences</u>: Sue Cook said 3 members are attending 3/14 Leadership Summit; still have openings for May and June trainings in Auburn (schedule already distributed—contact Sue).

<u>Activities</u>: Movie in the Park schedule distributed; Will need volunteers for Downtown Tuesday Nights start 5/15; Earth Day Sat. 4/21 at Royer Park by Placer Arts Council; First Fridays for May and June. Chili cook Off 3/16—Scott has tickets to sell at \$20 each. Jamie Garrett announced Sylvia Besana Volunteer Award was open, check website.
