RCONA Executive Reports

Approval of June 2018 Minutes: Hearing no inquiries or objections, the President ordered the minutes of the June 2018 meeting accepted and placed on file.

Receipt of Treasurer's Report: One suggestion received to expand 6/22 PayPal transfer (Kettle Corn). With that note to be added, the President ordered the Treasurer's Report dated January 1, 2018 to July 17, 2018, placed on file as submitted.

Public Comment: Werner noted August's guest speaker topic: Small Cell Towers. Larry noted new location for RCONA maps on City's website needs to be connected on RCONA site.

Updates from NA Representatives (shown above)

Roseville Police: Melisa Ingram (replacing Rob Baquera while he is interim PIO); items covered:

- Detailed crime statistics—format changing to 10-year-to-date instead of one-year-to-date reporting.
- Smash & Grab incidents—Gibson/Roseville Pkwy, Hyatt Hotel area—30-50 cars broken into. Hit & run stats up, DUI down, Traffic Division concentration on top 3 areas, including Douglas corridor and Pleasant Grove Blvd.
- Take/Lock/Hide—program to promote awareness (i.e. Galleria/hotels/restaurants).
- June to September—high time for garage burglaries—keep main and side doors closed.
- Police reports are available through Public Records Act; submit request via online form and pay applicable fee.
- Discussions for ‘solicitors’—report to police non-emergency; they must have full-page color business license issued with their name on it (have to apply for City permit first). Leaving a flyer is not soliciting (but cannot contain advertising for sales); religious representatives are not considered soliciting.

Fire Department: Jaime Garrett gave the following updates:

- Fires on Tues. July 17th in downtown are (Darling/Saugstad areas)—joint investigation underway (police & fire) and patrols increased.
- Station #1—dedication Sat. Aug. 18th, 9-11 AM, all invited, dedication to Chief Green.
- Old Station #1 still in escrow.
- Fallen fire fighter from Placer County—services will be held at Bayside Church.

Folsom Road—Presentation from Dutch Brothers Coffee at August meeting—neighborhood controversy over project.

Technology—NA Banners distributed, Promote Me suggestions—roll, don’t fold, clean with mild soap and water.

Pleasant Grove—Robert attended 2-hour fraud presentation, encouraged NAs to document everything to protect against fraud (felt RCONA procedures well documented), NAs handed out 43 new neighbor bags this month (City supplies getting low); picked up 4 Neighborhood Watch signs (\$80 check given to Sue tonight); MITP pizza sales proceeding—will coordinate with Stoneridge for next movie.

WestPark--Contacted developers to have repairs made to neighborhood monument and tiles;
City update (per Scott): Roseville City officials are available to attend meetings ‘for informational purposes only’ for its proposed half-cent sales tax initiative [Measure B] placed on the November ballot. [RCONA/NAs cannot take position for or against initiatives.] Scott will be holding some community coffees.

Roseville Heights—Will hold NNO at Weber Park; helping with pizza sales at MITP.

Cresthaven—NNO at Jack Wallace Park; Garage Sale following Sat. (Aug. 11th) 7AM-1PM;

South Cirby—NNO @ Crestmont Park; Garage Sale Sat. Oct. 6th.

Stoneridge—Had to cancel NNO—conflict with back-to-school night; may change to National Neighborhood Day (Sept. 16th—will contact Sue); will contact to have Measure B presentation.

Maidu—NNO at Maidu Park, newsletter distributed.

Cherry Glen/Theiles Manor—Planning NNO with Folsom Road NA at Johnson Pool; Natasha Martin (Roseville Library) was guest speaker at last meeting; found newsletter volunteers while giving welcome bags; noted first year for K-8 schools early start to align with high school terms.

Fiddymont Farm—Planning for NNDay with WestPark; Sutter Health presented this month—will move into Blue Oaks & Fiddymont Road building, open family medicine in early 2019, lab draws, no pharmacy or x-rays facilities. Will invite Measure B presentation for Oct. meeting; 6th high school to open 2020.

Woodcreek Oaks—Planning for NNO.

Cirby Ranch—Recruiting to replace 2 board members, elections in August (no July meeting); will move to quarterly meetings next year; will invite Placer Elder Protect for presentation [Sue attended event at Galleria and said event was very well staffed—lots of agencies represented].

Sierra Vista—Losing 2 board members, large ‘rental’ population unaware/not interested.

Agenda Items & Committee Updates:

Library in Park—Robert inquired if RCONA was going to have a booth at Mark White Park-- Werner indicated this was probably the last one of the summer’s program.

“Hold Harmless Agreement”—Werner presented RCONA’s new waiver form (approved by insurance agent) to have vendors sign; sample given out and Sue will distribute copies to all board members, along with ‘insurance incident’ report forms (also previously distributed).

Meetings with “City/RCONA”—Jim said Mayor Rohan feels RCONA is a viable stakeholder in the Roseville community. Bob Velcheck will attend City Manager meeting (Aug. 15th); Jim wants someone to attend “Megan/RCONA” (Aug.9th 8:30 AM)—contact Jim if you can appear to discuss issues for your NA.

Miscellaneous—April mentioned ‘cockroaches’ at parks; Larry gave info of pest infestation at Cresthaven area; Sue expressed concern that City attention is needed to address the issue.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:20 PM.
